## Last Week:

Blair continued the series by talking about the *how* we connect with God. We now have looked at three tools God uses to connect people to himself. The 3 tools are Prayer, People, Bible.

Can you share a time when you left the Bible with a revived soul?

Explain the word trustworthy (v7). What does that look like in our lives?

I must come with an attitude of humility. What does that mean? What is it going to take for me to grow in this area?

I have to have a time, place and a plan. Share with the group how you structure your time. Can I implement a strategy here?

I need to consistently apply it to my life. How can I involve the group in my application of the Scriptures?
